SEMI-ANNUAL IMPACT REPORT

Lily^{*}, a five-year-old girl in EverFree's care, smiled up at me (Kelsey) last month. Yes, you read that correctly...*just five years old*. I could see that she'd just lost her two front teeth. She was so very young. I watched as she and the other children danced and laughed until they collapsed on the floor giggling. As I held her hand while she sang "a million dreams for the world we're gonna make" from the Greatest Showman, my heart swelled with hope.

This is what is possible when we provide care and support to survivors. They are able to dream again.

Yet, right now as you read this, there are **millions** of children just like Lily living in exploitation. The latest global estimates for human trafficking are bleak. In the last five years, trafficking has not decreased but grown by 22%. **Fifty million people are victims of human trafficking.** And less than 1% will get the support and care needed to truly heal from trauma and rebuild their lives.

When I (Jeremy), led anti-trafficking work for a US-based foundation in the late 2000's, I had the privilege of supporting many grassroots organizations. But, while good work was taking place, many were underfunded and under-supported, unable to grow to serve the number of survivors that desperately needed their services. Most leaders I spoke to were isolated and burning out. Far too many of these organizations could not sustain their work at the level required to meet the overwhelming needs around them.

It was conversations about this lack of progress and the urgent needs of survivors, and the operations that support them, that led Kelsey and I to dream about merging our two organizations. We believed that by bringing Willow International and 10ThousandWindows together as EverFree, we could be stronger and make faster progress. **And we are.**

Despite the realities that oppose us, we are driven by the belief that human trafficking is not inevitable–It can be stopped.

And, we are thrilled to share that in just 8 months together, we've made substantial progress. Uniting our two organizations has accelerated our reach and impact and we couldn't have done it without your support.

Since January 2022, 617 survivors of trafficking and exploitation have received care and support on their journeys to freedom. We opened a new shelter in a trafficking hotspot where only months ago no services for trafficking victims were available. Frontline counselors held 4,893 sessions with survivors to help them process trauma. And 67 survivors either secured dignified employment or started their own businesses. With your support, EverFree helped bring 30 traffickers to justice, and we sustained our 95% success rate in preventing re-victimization.

We are at a pivotal time in history. Trafficking is not decreasing. And the time to take action to end modern-day slavery is \mathbf{now} – millions of lives depend on it.

EverFree's mission has never been more important.

OUR MISSION

Together, we free communities from human trafficking and empower survivors everywhere to flourish in freedom—forever.

We have a bold, perhaps audacious vision: that EVERY survivor in the world has access to quality care. We have a plan to achieve this ambitious goal through our comprehensive and research-based model. The EverFree model focuses on three survivor-led solutions to end human-trafficking, which you can read more about in the following pages:





1. Restore survivors with the care they need to flourish in freedom 2. Prevent trafficking by strengthening communities to stop it before it happens

Human trafficking may seem dark and overwhelming, but we remain hopeful. We firmly believe that trafficking can be stopped. And, we believe that the EverFree model will accelerate freedom for all and to end trafficking for good.

But we can't do it alone.



Safe Homes

EverFree's residential aftercare programs help each survivor heal from exploitation through individualized, comprehensive care. Every safe home provides secure shelter in a supportive and loving community, individualized case management, nutritious food, trauma counseling, and medical and psychiatric care.

LILY SINGS AGAIN

Five-year-old Lily loves to sing along to "A Million Dreams" from The Greatest Showman, belting out the chorus at the top of her lungs:

A million dreams is all it's gonna take Oh a million dreams for the world we're gonna make

This is a marked change from when she arrived at EverFree's safe home. Lily's trafficker sought to rob her of dignity, hope, and life itself. Instead of dreams, she was plagued with nightmares.

"It is crucial that Lily receives protection and care," her caseworker says. "At our residential care shelter we protect her from the abuse, neglect, and stigma often seen in similar cases. The immediate trauma left her crying for weeks, but she is now increasingly stable and enjoying the shelter's love and care."

Through EverFree's residential care, Lily receives counseling and care for her trauma. She has safety and space to heal. She is free to be a child. Now, Lily looks forward to singing with her friends, playing ball, and dancing in her little purple shoes. Her life has just begun, her dreams for the future have just started to take shape. There, Lily and girls like her can play and sing and dream of the world they're going to make.



Empowerment Centers

Developed in partnership with survivors, EverFree's Empowerment Centers are hubs of healing in local communities. Each center provides holistic economic empowerment services including individualized case management, education scholarships, vocational training, and job placement, which help each individual to achieve financial stability and lasting freedom.

FREE TO WRITE HER OWN STORY

Chesah was 15 when her friend introduced her to a man who promised she would make a good salary if she worked for him. Instead of a good job, Chesah was trafficked in commercial sexual exploitation.

One day, a group of social workers were doing outreach in her community and told Chesah about EverFree's Empowerment Center. Chesah saw this as her chance to build her future—one without abuse and exploitation.

At EverFree, Chesah received counseling and completed goal development and skills training. She also earned a scholarship to complete high school.

This year, Chesah started work as an artisan for a local company. She earns a good salary and is saving up for college. Chesah dreams of becoming a social worker like the one who first reached out to her.

"EverFree opened a lot of doors for me—I got a scholarship, and then with a high school diploma, I got a job. It seemed impossible for me to do all these things if I wasn't given the opportunity. Yet my story remains unfinished. And it is up to me how to finish it."

OUR SOLUTIONS

TRAFFICKING Ververks to stop

trafficking before it starts and change the systems that allow it to thrive.

We strengthen communities, frontline responders, and survivor leaders with knowledge and solutions to fight human-trafficking before it happens and keep communities safe.

WHAT DOES PREVENTION LOOK LIKE?

- Teach communities about human trafficking including how to identify victims, how to report and stop it, and how to support survivors.
- Educate youth about human trafficking and their rights, how to identify risks (in person and online), and how to protect themselves and seek help.
- Equip organizations, policymakers, and funders with survivor-centered data to better understand the systemic issues that contribute to trafficking; develop and deploy more effective prevention interventions.
- Train the justice sector to identify trafficking, support survivors in the legal process, and ensure traffickers are held accountable and stopped from trafficking.




When EverFree leaders met domestic trafficking survivor, Rachael Harvey, at an art exhibit in Orange County last year, it was the start of a powerful friendship. Trafficked at a young age, Rachael experienced more horrors than most anyone can imagine. Yet she stood bravely in front of social workers and frontline responders determined to use her story and her art to prevent this from happening to other children.

This year, Rachel is partnering with EverFree to launch our US prevention efforts. As trafficking spikes in middle and highincome countries - right here in our backyards - it's more critical than ever that we equip communities to prevent it.

OUR SOLUTIONS

INNOVATION & Scale

With your support, EverFree replicates better evidence-based care for survivors to accelerate the end of human trafficking.

Trafficking has increased 22% over the past five years, yet less than 1% of survivors get any care at all. We must move faster to connect survivors everywhere with the care they need to thrive in freedom and to empower communities to stop trafficking for good.

By scaling better evidence-based care to frontline responders and applying our model in trafficking hot spots, together we can help more survivors and end trafficking faster.



SCALING THE FIGHT AGAINST TRAFFICKING Every day, EverFree's phones ring with referrals for girls in urgent need of life-saving care.

To reach more survivors with the care they need to rebuild their lives and thrive in freedom, EverFree opened a new shelter for trafficking victims in collaboration with Hope's Cry earlier this year.


Based in Karamoja, the shelter serves one of the most vulnerable regions of Uganda, which is known for sky high poverty rates and widespread child trafficking.

Led by Lilian Nalukwago, EverFree's International Program Development Manager, the EverFree team in Uganda collaborated with Hope's Cry to understand the needs of survivors and local communities in the region, and deploy the EverFree model tailored to those needs. By training Hope's Cry staff in trauma-informed approaches and building a clear referral pathway for first responders, EverFree helped launch the shelter and increase the capacity of local leaders to support human trafficking survivors with high-quality care.

"The impact of this program has already been overwhelmingly positive," says Michelle Allen of Hope's Cry. "We couldn't have done any of this without EverFree. **To meet the incredible need in the area** we serve, EverFree has given us the foundation to help us grow quickly, efficiently and with the maximum impact possible."

EverFree continues to support the shelter program with staff training and capacity building. After a few short months, the impact is already being seen as survivors in the program find healing and take steps towards lasting freedom. The local government and community are grateful to finally have a program dedicated to stopping trafficking and supporting survivors.

"When the girls first came to the shelter, they felt that there was no ray of hope and had given up on life," Lilian Nalukwago says. "But now, one can see a ray of hope in their eyes. Through medical and psychosocial support, literacy skills, and vocational skills training, the girls are confident that what they have learned will be of great use toward economically empowering themselves and their families."


