THE ISSUE

50 million people around the world live in situations of trafficking and exploitation, according to a report released by the International Labor Organization and Walk Free in 2022 — that's nearly a 10 million increase in the men, women, and children subjected to modern day slavery.

Of these millions of victims, less than 1% receive the care they need.



Vulnerability to trafficking has been further exacerbated by widespread poverty, the pandemic, natural disasters, displacement, war, and global famine in addition to systemic failures that were intended to support the most vulnerable populations.

What's more, traffickers take advantage of new technology to streamline trafficking operations. With the proliferation of social media platforms, online marketplaces, and encrypted communication channels, traffickers use these tools to lure, manipulate, and connect with potential victims. Further, the anonymity offered by the internet helps traffickers evade detection and render their profits near untraceable.

The fight against trafficking must keep up— now, more than ever, innovation is crucial.

Through our data-driven, survivor-centered work, EverFree seeks to scale freedom for survivors around the world. In partnering with frontline organizations and institutions and in amplifying how survivors define freedom, we are disrupting cycles of exploitation and vulnerability.



Our dedicated professionals provide quality survivor aftercare and prevention to vulnerable individuals and communities in Human Trafficking hotspots around the world.

With help from EverFree, she was able to undergo therapy and enroll in classes to further her education and career.

WE IMPROVE IMPACT AND SCALE IT GLOBALLY

In 2022, EverFree pioneered Freedom Greenlight, a first-of-its-kind online needs assessment for human trafficking survivors that is strengths-based, participatory, and incorporates multidimensional aspects of well-being. We established global partnerships to pilot Freedom Greenlight in seven communities worldwide, significantly expanding our reach to empowering survivors globally.

EverFree's partner replication model, introduced with Hope's Cry in Karamoja, Uganda, was also launched in 2022 to scale EverFree's effective program model.

NEW SHELTER OPENS IN KARAMOJA, UGANDA

To reach more survivors with the care they need, EverFree opened a new shelter in in collaboration with Hope's Cry earlier this year, serving Karamoja, one of the most vulnerable regions of Uganda, which is known for sky high poverty rates and widespread child trafficking.

To reach 1 Million survivors by 2033.



HOPE THROUGH IMPACT

Led by Lilian Nalukwago, EverFree's International Program Development Manager, the EverFree team in Uganda collaborated with Hope's Cry to understand the needs of survivors and local communities in the Karamoja region, using the EverFree model tailored to those needs. By training Hope's Cry staff in trauma-informed approaches and building a clear referral pathway for first responders, EverFree helped launch a new safe home and increase the capacity of local leaders to support human trafficking survivors with high-quality care.

EverFree continues to support the shelter program with staff training and capacity building. After a few short months, the impact is already being seen as survivors in the program find healing and take steps towards lasting freedom. The local government and community are grateful to finally have a program dedicated to stopping trafficking and supporting survivors.

"When the girls first came to the shelter, they felt that there was no ray of hope and had given up on life," Lilian Nalukwago says. "But now, one can see a ray of hope in their eyes. Through medical and psychosocial support, literacy skills, and vocational skills training, the girls are confident that what they have learned will be of great use toward economically empowering themselves and their families."

EVERFREE & UCI: WORKING TOGETHER TOWARDS SOLUTIONS THAT WORK

EverFree's partnership with the UC Irvine Blum Center for Poverty Alleviation centers around researched-backed anti-trafficking solutions. Together with the Blum Center, we are addressing the gaps in anti-trafficking response through survivor perspectives, evidence, and collaboration.

An ongoing project with the Blum Center involves adapting the Poverty Stoplight— a lived experience-led tech platform for poverty alleviation— into the Freedom Greenlight for survivors of trafficking. We have developed a self-assessment tool that would provide valuable insight into the efficacy of solutions for survivors' actual needs with an emphasis on empowering survivors. A crucial aspect of this research has been the comprehensive analysis of how a global cohorts of survivors from diverse backgrounds define freedom in order to ensure that our programming, as well as others, is aligned with and supports these definitions through the implementation of effective solutions.

SURVIVOR STORIES

JUSTICE FOR ELLA*

Content Warning: This story contains references to trauma and sexual violence.

16-year-old Ella* felt hopeful when a neighbor offered her a promising job opportunity in Kampala. As the eldest of four siblings, Ella felt that a good, reliable job would be a chance to help her family survive. But when it was time for the neighbor to help Ella get to her new job, she instead led Ella two men on a motorcycle taxi, who forced Ella to inhale chloroform until she passed out.

Ella woke up to find herself tied down and confined in a small, dark room. There she was assaulted and abused for seven days. At times, Ella would overhear the men arguing amongst themselves whether to kill her or just dump her by the road. They sedated her once more.

When Ella regained consciousness, she found herself in an unknown town and in horrific physical pain as a result of the gruesome sexual exploitation. A passerby came across Ella and helped her reach her parents, who had been on a frantic search for their daughter.

Suffering from extensive trauma, Ella was referred to EverFree's aftercare shelter where she immediately received care, counseling, and legal aid. EverFree stood by Ella through months of court hearings.

Thanks to Ella's courageous testimony, the court sentenced her trafficker to 20 years in prison.

What's more, Ella's trafficker will be forced to pay her restitution. EverFree's legal team has further hope that the investigation will lead to identification and accountability for the nine men now on the run.

But for now, Ella is focusing on healing and pursuing her education as she continues to receive followup care from EverFree. Upon winning her court case, Ella quoted Cornel West, saying,

"Justice is what love looks like in public!"

A MILLION DREAMS OF FREEDOM

Five-year-old Lily* loves to sing along to "A Million Dreams" from The Greatest Showman, belting out the chorus at the top of her lungs:

A million dreams is all it's gonna take Oh a million dreams for the world we're gonna make

This is a marked change from when she arrived at EverFree's safe home. Lily's trafficker sought to rob her of dignity, hope, and life itself. Instead of dreams, she was plaqued with nightmares.

"It is crucial that Lily receives protection and care," her caseworker says. "At our residential care shelter we protect her from the abuse, neglect, and stigma often seen in similar cases. The immediate trauma left her crying for weeks, but she is now increasingly stable and enjoying the shelter's love and care."

Through EverFree's residential care, Lily receives counseling and care for her trauma. She has safety and space to heal. **She is free to be a child**.

Now, Lily looks forward to singing with her friends, playing ball, and dancing in her little purple shoes. Her life has just begun, her dreams for the future have just started to take shape. There, Lily and girls like her can play and sing and dream of the world they're going to make.

FREE TO WRITE HER OWN STORY

Chesah* was 15 when her friend introduced her to a man who promised she would make a good salary if she worked for him. Instead of a good job, Chesah was trafficked in commercial sexual exploitation.

One day, a group of social workers were doing outreach in her community and told Chesah about EverFree's Empowerment Center. Chesah saw this as her chance to build her future—one without abuse and exploitation.

At EverFree, Chesah received counseling and completed goal development and skills training. She also earned a scholarship to complete high school.

This year, Chesah started work as an artisan for a local company. She earns a good salary and is saving up for college. Chesah dreams of becoming a social worker like the one who first reached out to her.

"EverFree opened a lot of doors for me—I got a scholarship, and then with a high school diploma, I got a job. It seemed impossible for me to do all these things if I wasn't given the opportunity. Yet my story remains unfinished. And it is up to me how to finish it."

TUSTIN MOMS TAKE ACTION

First bonding over a Bracelets for Change bracelet supporting EverFree (then Willow International) at the community pool, a group of moms soon found a shared desire to take further action. They decided to host a fundraiser to raise awareness and support for EverFree's work in empowering survivors and preventing human trafficking.

"When I learned about the unspeakable circumstances that children, women, and men were enduring it broke my heart in a way that I could never look back," says Elsa, Tustin mom and EverFree advocate.

"Once you know you can never ignore it. Knowing that I could impact a few lives through organizations like EverFree was game changer for me. I'm grateful that I can continue to support this cause through the resources available and that I can spread the word on WHAT human trafficking is and how we as a community can help."

FINANCIALS 2022


