FOREWORD FROM THE FREEDOM LIFEMAP CO-FOUNDERS

Exploitation is one of the worst human rights issues in our world today, depriving over 50 million people of their basic right to freedom. As the problem worsens, the sector has lagged in its efforts—only 1% of individuals affected by modern slavery are identified and receive the support they need, efforts are siloed and inefficient, and gaps persist in data to identify solutions.

Through Freedom Lifemap, we can attain this data. We have global collaboration and effective care. And we as a sector can be stronger in the fight against modern slavery and exploitation.

Through the revolutionary intersection between tech and advocacy, Freedom Lifemap equips organizations with a research-backed, survivor-informed model to identify what works and scale those solutions to drive systemic change against exploitation.

As of this year, we have conducted Freedom Lifemap assessments with 726 participants around the world. We are seeing Freedom Lifemap's impact on all levels: individuals have visualized their strengths and have been equipped with a Lifemap towards their goals. Organizations now have strong insights to effectively strengthen their programming. And—on a global scale—we are collaborating with partners all over the world to use powerful data to scale solutions.

We are thrilled to share these initial insights with you through Freedom Lifemap's inaugural impact report, and look forward to our journey ahead as we envision **a Lifemap in the hands of every survivor.**

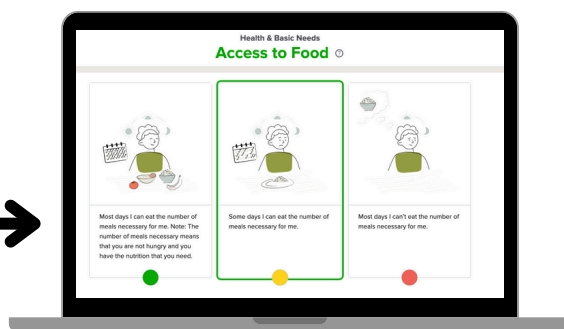
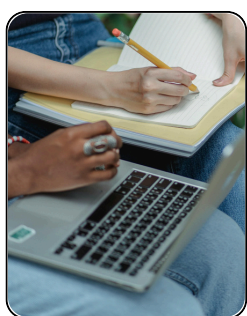

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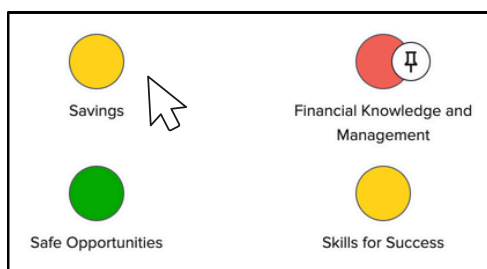
HOW FREEDOM LIFEMAP WORKS

EverFree's Freedom Lifemap technology connects survivors with individualized care and strengthens organizations with data to guide and improve programs, measure outcomes, and stop exploitation.

Freedom Lifemap assesses strengths and vulnerabilities using 49 indicators across six dimensions of well-being to measure of freedom.



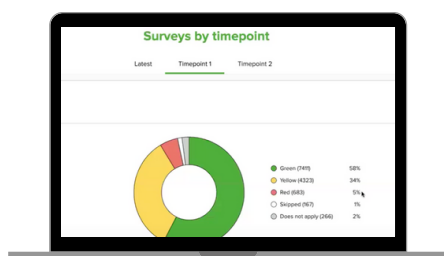

Upon completion, the platform provides a visualized Lifemap dashboard of the participant's responses.

With their case worker, participants use their Lifemap to set priorities and develop an individualized case plan.

After 6 months of programming, participants retake the assessment to track progress.

FREEDOM LIFEMAP TAPS INTO POWER OF DATA AT SCALE

Freedom Lifemap leverages a public health model, where data goes beyond merely reflecting problems—but actively creates solutions. Unlike traditional data approaches that primarily identify and quantify the problem of exploitation, this model generates data through the process of solving issues in real-time.

FREEDOM LIFEMAP HELPS PEOPLE MOVE TOWARDS STRONGER OUTCOMES

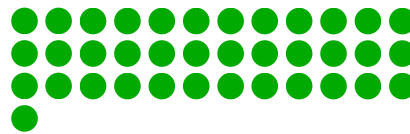
Participants who used Freedom Lifemap in their care plans from the start of their care were **1.65 times** more likely to improve their well-being compared to those who didn't use the tool.



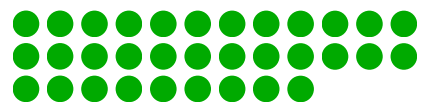
Better Results with Freedom Lifemap:

When Freedom Lifemap was used to create care plans, participants selected more green responses one year later than participants who didn't use Freedom Lifemap.

Strengths achieved without Freedom Lifemap



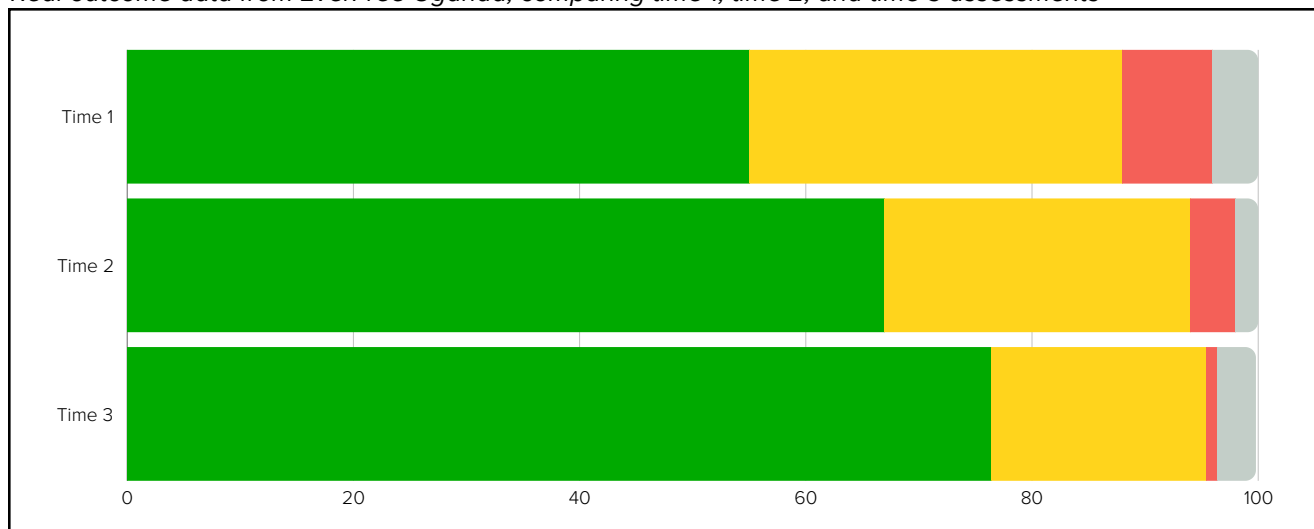
With Freedom Lifemap, we track outcomes to understand participants' progress towards well-being. Every 6 months, participants retake the assessment to track their progress.

Real outcome data from EverFree Uganda, comparing time 1, time 2, and time 3 assessments



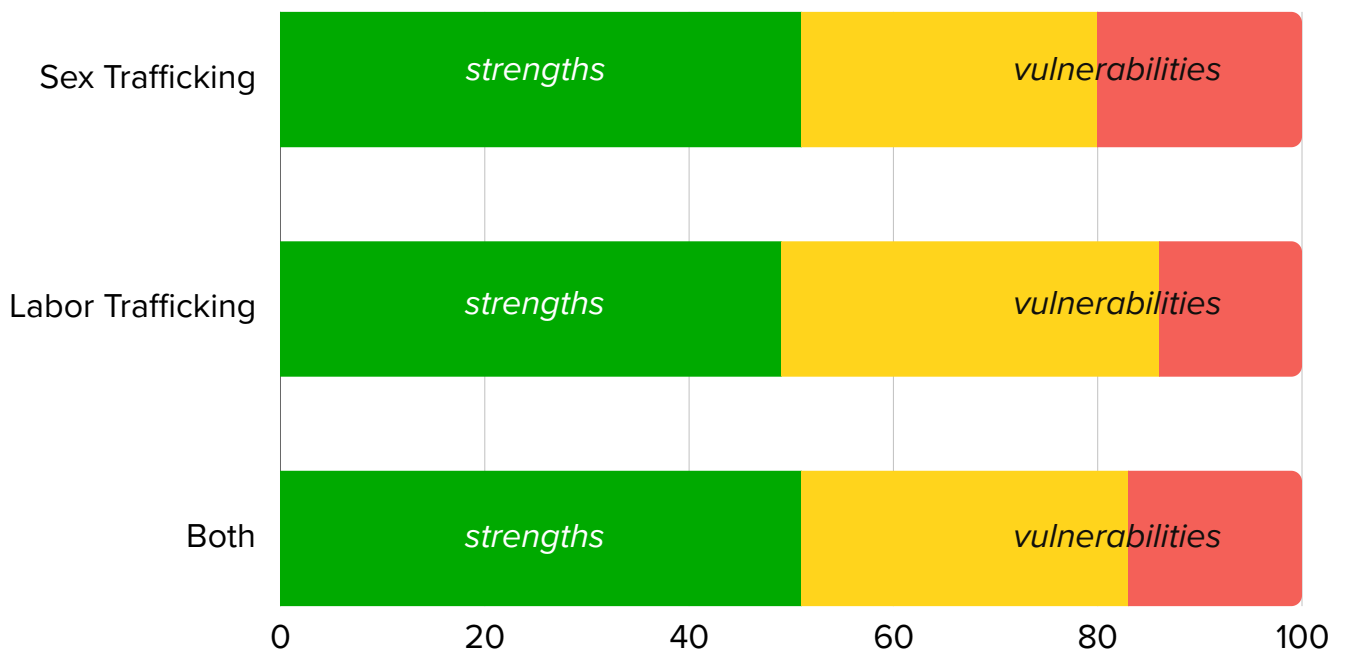
FREEDOM LIFEMAP SUPPORTS SURVIVORS BY BREAKING DOWN MYTHS

Technology Innovation — Following the successful launch of Freedom Lifemap platform, Phase 2 of technology development will enhance the tool with innovative features to improve survivor outcomes, strengthen data protection and security, and revolutionize customization for scalability.



Growth and Scale — By 2025, EverFree will expand Freedom Lifemap to over 70 organizations, impacting thousands of survivors. This global initiative will broaden access to the tool, and includes tailored customization of Freedom Lifemap and specialized training for organizations worldwide.



Research and Advocacy — Research data from Freedom Lifemap is critical to measuring impact, and improving care for survivors. Our research and advocacy agenda will overlay Freedom Lifemap findings with localized trends and data at scale, providing insights that will accelerate prevention and stop exploitation.
